President's Corner - Marc K. Mays, President

I have been a respiratory therapist for over 30 years, and a manager of a respiratory care department for over 20 years. It has also been my pleasure to serve on the Ohio Respiratory Care Board for 2 1/2 years. Over this time one thing has become very clear to me --- respiratory care has changed, is changing and will continue to change. As practicing therapists, I am certain this truth has become clear to you, too. This is not a stagnant profession. It evolves as technology and practice methodology evolves. The entry requirements are far more stringent today and necessarily so. To succeed in the current health care environment requires more than simply showing up to work, going through some motions and checking out at the end of the day.

A successful respiratory therapist today must be able to demonstrate real commitment to the profession "on and off the field." Many things that make therapists great are due to endeavors pursued on their own time, not sponsored by an employer. Employers do, however, provide a multitude of opportunities to help therapists improve, remain competent, or expand their role. Here's a few thoughts to help all of us achieve success:

Currently only 50% of Ohio's new graduates take and pass the Registered Respiratory Therapist examination. Attainment of the highest credential possible is a must. Professional examinations should be taken and passed soon after graduation. Waiting to long after graduation invites failure. If remediation is needed, get it. Trends, from my perspective, indicate that RRT minimal qualifications may become the standard.

Second, commit to staying current and competent. The continuing education requirements for licensing were not designed to be a bureaucratic hoop for licensing renewal. Therapists need to look at continuing education as an opportunity to improve, learn something new, or relearn something forgotten. The Board's continuing education audits, unfortunately, are sometimes very disappointing. It should come as no surprise that the Board is considering increasing the continuing education requirements. The national average is 20 hours every two years.

Third, professionalism is the key to peer recognition and quality care. Great therapist are often defined a "professionals." The fact is we should all be professionals. Our licensure title includes the term and it should embody our work ethic, our decision making and our drive to learn more.

NBRC Policies Taking Effect in 2007

Two long awaited policy initiatives released several years ago by the National Board for Respiratory Care, Inc. (NBRC) will take effect in 2007. The first is the NBRC's continuing competency program. This program actu-

ally began on July 1, 2002. Any person earning a credential from the NBRC after July 1, 2002, is assigned an automatic credential expiration date of five years from the date of issue. July 1, 2007 is the first continuing competency due date for

credential holders. If a credential holder fails to meet the continuing competency requirements for the credential held, the credential will lapse five years after the original issue date. If a credential holder meets the credential renewal requirements through the continued competency program, the active term of the credential will be extended for another five years.

The Ohio Respiratory Care Board reviewed the NBRC's

policy when first announced and issued a statement that the program would not affect a person's license status in Ohio if a person failed to meet the NBRC's continuing competency requirements.

On the other hand, active credentialing may be an employment requirement, so credentialed persons need to be aware of the provisions of the new policy. Each credential (eg. CRT, RRT, CPFT, etc.) has independent continuing competency requirements and there are three options available. Additionally, it is important to recognize the difference between requirements for license renewal (a mandatory state law) and national credentialing renewal (voluntary). With careful planning, you can meet both requirements.

Option #1: Provide proof of completion of a minimum of 30 hours of Category 1 Continuing Education acceptable to the NBRC. Continuing education requirements are based upon the creden-

tials held. The NBRC "intends for the completion of continuing education credit to coordinate with the requirements of state licensure agencies." In general, if you meet the Board's continuing education requirements every two years, you should meet the NBRC's requirements. However, in some cases, the NBRC requirements are more specific to the highest credential held and may be more stringent than the Board's continuing education rules. The NBRC's credential specific requirements exceed the state's requirements. If you meet the NBRC's continued competency requirements for content while fulfilling the hour requirements for your state of Ohio license prior to the expiration date of the license each renewal period, you should meet both the state of Ohio's and the NBRC's requirements.

Option #2: Retake and pass the respective examination for the highest credential held. Again, this requirement meets

the state of Ohio's requirements for license renewal for a two year period as long as the examination is completed prior to the expiration date of the license. You would not be required to do anything more for the renewal of your NBRC credential(s), but you would need to complete additional Continuing Education for subsequent renewal of your Ohio license.

Option #3: Pass an NBRC credentialing examination not previously completed. Again, this requirement meets the state of Ohio's requirements for license renewal as long as the examination is completed prior to the expiration date of the license. The second NBRC policy being implemented addresses examination eligibility requirements. Beginning January 1, 2006, all candidates **MUST** have an associate degree or higher from an accredited respiratory therapy education program to be eligible for the CRT and RRT Examinations.

Board Proposes Increasing Continuing Education Requirements

The Ohio Respiratory Care Board recently charged the Board's rules committee with surveying continuing education requirements in all other 46 licensed states in the United States. The committee completed this work and recommended increasing Ohio's continuing education requirements for both licensed respiratory care professionals and experienced-based limited permit holders (L2 permits).

Forty-eight states were reviewed. Alaska and Hawaii do not require a license to practice respiratory care. Colorado, Utah, and Wisconsin do not have any continuing education requirements. Ohio's continuing education requirements for respiratory care professionals ranked in the lowest among the forty-five states that require continuing education. Only five states require twelve (12) contact hours of continuing education every two years. Ohio, being one of the five states, re-



quires licensees to complete twelve (12) contact for the biennial license renewal and limited permit (L2s) to complete six (6) contact hours. The mean number of contact hours nationwide is twenty (20).

The Board's rules committee recommended increasing the contact hour requirements to the national mean, requiring licensees to obtain twenty (20) contact hours of RCCE every two years and experience-based limited permit holders to obtain ten (10) contact hours of continuing education every year.

In addition, the committee recommended that the Board adopt a new continuing education component that would mandate licensees to complete a percentage of education in legal (dealing with the Board laws and rules) and medical ethics education.

In June, 2006, the Board began drafting new continuing education rules. Three drafts have been filed and none

have been approved for filing to become permanent rules. In addition, the Board has not chosen an effective date for implementation of the new program. It is likely; however, that the Board will delay the effective date until the beginning of the next full two-year renewal cycle, providing licensees with an opportunity to learn more about the regulations before they become effective.

The Board recommends that licensees closely observe the development of these new requirements and, if necessary, become engaged in the process. Once draft rules are filed, anyone can comment on the rules through the public hearing process. The Board encourages licensee participation in this process to create the best policy for Ohio citizens and the practicing clinicians. Three New Respiratory Care Programs Open in Ohio



Rising demand for respiratory therapist in the state of Ohio has led three communities to conclude Ohio requires more respiratory care educational programs. Since June of this year, the Ohio Respiratory Care Board has recognized three new respiratory care edu-

ational programs in the state of Ohio: Southern State Community College in Hillsboro, Ohio; Buckeye Hill Community College and Rio Grande University in Rio Grande, Ohio; and Miami Jacobs Career College in Dayton, Ohio.

Rio Grande University and Southern State Community College were recognized by the Board in June 2006. Both of these schools will offer a traditional Associate Degree advanced level curriculum in respiratory care. Miami Jacobs Career College were recognized by the Board in August 2006. Miami Jacobs Career College is a private college that will also award an Associate Degree advance level curriculum in respiratory care. The educational approach at Miami Jacobs is not a traditional curricula, but a modified approach offering single classes in a concentrated format. Each program has been awarded a letter of review by the Committee on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP). For more information on these programs go to:

2006 Ohio Education Report Available

The second update on respiratory care educational programs in Ohio was completed and posted to the Board's website this year. The report is a seven year retrospective analysis of student data from Ohio's nineteen respiratory care programs (now 21). Results indicate a promising trend in enrollments and graduation rates in the state of Ohio. Between 2003 and 2007 applications to Ohio respiratory care programs rose from 453 to 819. Enrollments rose from 266 to 392 over the same period, while attrition was relatively unchanged. Graduation rates rose from 185 in 2000 to 264 in 2005, a 43% increase. Of concern to the Board; however, is the student pass rates on the National Board for Respiratory Care, Inc.'s Respiratory Therapist examinations. From 2000 through 2004, percent of the total graduates passing the NBRC's CRT examination remained constant (>85%). Graduates passing the RRT examination over the same period, also did not change significantly (only approximately 50% pass rate). Also concerning, although demand for respiratory therapists remains strong, the number of new graduates not employed within three months of graduation rose in 2004 and again in 2005.

Persons practicing beyond the expiration date of their license are subject to disciplinary sanctions by the Ohio Respiratory Care Board. Take some time to check your expiration date. Continuing Education Audits Issued for 2004 – 2006 Renewal Cycle

315 mandatory random audit notices were mailed to respiratory care professionals requesting proof of continuing education compliance for the 2004—2006 licensing renewal period. Licensees have until September 30, 2006, to send the Board proof of completing the continuing education reported to the Board on their electronic online or hand completed renewal application.

The most common problems found by the board are:

1. Failure to complete the required continuing education requirements as reported. Continuing education submitted in response to the audit does not match the reported continuing education.
2. Licensees fail to produce proof of all or some of the reported continuing education.
3. Continuing education provided was not completed within the period of time required by law.
4. Continuing education reported was used for a prior reporting period, resulting in no continuing education completed for the new biennial cycle.

Recommendations: Maintain a copy of all RCCE reported on renewals, keep documentation of RCCE for two renewal cycles (four years), complete all RCCE within the two year period required under OAC 4761-9, and never falsify a report to the board.



Did you move or change your name?

Ohio law mandates that you advise the Board within sixty days of a change in address, name, or employment. Each biennial renewal, hundreds of renewal applications are returned, re-mailed, or lost due to old address information. If you have not kept the Board up-to-date, please do so.
